4. Complete the **PRACTICE SCOTUS COMPARISON QUESTION** below:

Gonzales v. Raich (2005), In 1996 California voters passed the Compassionate Use Act, legalizing marijuana for medical use. California's law conflicted with the federal Controlled Substances Act (CSA), which banned possession of marijuana. After the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) seized doctor-prescribed marijuana from a patient's home, a group of medical marijuana users sued the DEA and U.S. Attorney General Alberto Gonzales in federal district court.

The medical marijuana users argued the Compassionate Use Act exceeded Congress' constitutional power. But the majority of the Supreme Court ruled that Congress did not exceed its constitutional power with its Controlled Substances Act. Justice John Paul Stevens argued that the Constitution gave Congress the authority to prohibit local cultivation and use of marijuana despite state laws to the contrary. Stevens argued that the Supreme Court's precedent "firmly established" Congress' power to regulate purely local economic activities that could be part of a national market.

- A. Identify a clause of the U.S. Constitution interpreted by the Supreme Court in both *Gonzales v. Raich* (2005) and *U.S. v. Lopez* (1995) to determine whether state governments or the national government had authority over local economic activities.
- B. Based on the constitutional clause identified in part A, explain how the facts of *Gonzales v*. *Raich* (2005) led to a different Supreme Court holding as the holding in *U.S. v. Lopez* (1995.)
- C. Explain how some states have changed their marijuana policies since the Supreme Court's holding in *Gonzales v. Raich* (2005.)
